DIRECTIONS TO THE FARM

From Canton: Take I-575/GA 515 six miles north of Jasper. Turn West onto GA, 136 West. Go 2 miles to fork in highway. Take left fork, GA 136 Connector. Go one mile to first road on right, Bunch Court (just beyond the highway guard rail). Turn right, go 1/2 mile to Farm entrance on right.

From Highway 53 (the intersection where 53 comes into 515 from the east) - From this intersection follow 515/53 north until 53 turns west off of 515, then follow 53 west to cluster of stores called Hinton (a total of 10 miles). Turn East onto GA 136 Connector. Go approx. 2 miles to first road on left, Bunch Court. Turn left, go 1/2 mile to Farm entrance on right.

From Highway 53 from Fairmount to the west of Jasper, go east 10 miles on 53 to cluster of stores called Hinton. Turn east onto GA 136 Connector. Go approx. 2 miles to first road on left, Bunch Court. Turn left, go 1/2 mile to Farm entrance on right.

Recipe Corner



Honey Brownies

1 Cup (6 ounces) Chocolate Chips 6 Tbsp Butter 2 Eggs 1/3 Cup Honey 1 Tsp Vanilla ¹/2 Cup All Purpose Flour ¹/2 Tsp Baking Powder Dash of Salt 1 Cup Chopped Walnuts (Optional)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Lightly grease 1 8inch square baking pan. Melt chocolate chips and butter in medium heavy saucepan over low heat. Remove from heat; cool slightly. Stir in eggs, honey and vanilla. Combine flour, baking powder, salt and walnuts in small bowl. Stir into chocolate mixture. Spread batter evenly into prepared pan. Bake 20-25 minutes or just until center feels springy. Cool in pan on wire rack. Cut into 2 inch squares.
